

CSA to Manage Changes to Canadian Technology Accreditation Standards

Technology Accreditation Canada (TAC) has engaged the Canadian Standards Association (CSA) to review and improve the Canadian Technology Accreditation Criteria (CTAC).

ASTTBC is inviting members to volunteer to assist with the CSA review.

TAC has been accepted by ASTTBC as the pan-Canadian corporation to carry out accreditation of engineering and applied science technology programs at institutes, colleges and universities offering programs in BC. The creation of TAC came about as a result of a loss of confidence in the accreditation program offered by the Canadian Technology Accreditation Board.

"While some technology programs in BC carry CTAB accreditation today, ASTTBC Council has indicated that CTAB accreditation is no longer recognized as the basis for certification and registration with ASTTBC," said Charles Joyner, ASTTBC Registrar. "ASTTBC is working with the BC institutions to support the transition to TAC accreditation."
