

Minister Mike Morris Connects with ASTTBC

Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General Mike Morris, MLA for Prince George-Mackenzie, met with ASTTBC Councilor, Heather Andreychuk, AScT and CEO John Leech, prior to the Premier's BC Natural Resource forum that took place in Prince George mid-January.

The three talked about a number of topics including the challenges ASTTBC members face in their rights to independent practice, implementation of PTech in BC and ASTTBC's proposal to change the ASTT Act to include a definition of scope of practice and rights to practice. ASTTBC has long proposed re-building technology programming at the College of New Caledonia and this was another key topic covered. ASTTBC supports the development of a Civil Engineering Technology Program.

The Minister was most engaging and aware of ASTTBC members and the contribution technologists, technicians and technical specialists make to BC's economy and the environment.
