Strategic Initiative

Promote technology education and careers within BC through leadership, advocacy and public awareness on strategies that ensure sustainable enrolment at BC's institutes, colleges and universities.

Key Success Factors

At the end of the three years (Fall 2011), TECC strategic initiatives will be well deployed with the right constituents (agencies and industry) who can make changes (and contribute to) providing solutions.

Success will look like:

1. Technology education and careers are viewed by key decision-makers as critical to British Columbia's growth and development. This understanding drives funding decisions.
2. Technology education, careers and programs in BC's post-secondary education system are well known.
3. Institutions who offer technology programs are "at capacity".
4. Industry is populated with properly skilled and fully enabled technology practitioners.
5. Reliable and current labour market information is available and serves as a key driver in setting educational strategies and outcomes.
6. Technology programs are located throughout BC to ensure reasonable access.
7. Involvement in technology education by under-represented groups such as First Nations, women and Internationally Trained Professionals is significantly improved.
8. A strategic direction for technology education and careers has been formulated, is widely accepted and is used for decision-making.
9. BC is a leader in formulating and carrying out a national strategy for technology education and careers.
10. Sustainable communication is in place.
