ASTTBC Directs Resources to Professional Regulation

The ASTTBC Council has approved enhanced professional regulation as the strategic direction for 2012 ó 2015. Working under the banner of *Serving the Public Interest Through Professional Accountability*, ASTTBC will re-direct funds and staffing to building on a strong professional regulatory foundation. “*The 2012 Work Plan supports this new direction,*” says ASTTBC Executive Director, John Leech. “*We will further develop areas such as peer reviews, mentoring, auditing, continuing professional development reporting, and errors & omissions insurance*”.

ASTTBC will very soon launch a new professionalism in practice & examination starting in 2012¹ and make the program available to post secondary institutions to offer to their students. To drive the applications process and all administration leading to certification and registration ASTTBC will be a lead association involved with Technology Registrations Canada (TRC), an on-line software package designed to take the association into a paperless world. A new membership management database will augment ASTTBC's move to enhancing an e-business model.
