**Our Liquid Waste Services Department is seeking an Engineering Technician I who will provide technical support to the wastewater, rainfall and drainage monitoring functions within the Liquid Waste Services Department.**

**You are: A grade 12 graduate with courses in trigonometry, plane geometry and drafting or a two year diploma graduate in Engineering Technology.**

### In this role, you will:

- Review flow monitoring and rainfall data for quality assurance and adjusts data as necessary. Respond to internal and external requests for data.
- Maintain contact with contractors and the public. Co-ordinate and review or inspect work performed by contractors and Metro Vancouver’s own work force.
- Review progress of contracted work and monthly invoices for work done.

- Perform other work of equal importance, difficulty and responsibility, requiring comparable qualifications such as:
  - Edit and create operations manuals, drawings, schematics and other facility documentation;
  - Review and approve invoices;
  - Prepare and certify requisitions for equipment, materials and services, and prepares contract documents;
  - Analyze utility monitoring data for improved operational efficiency and understanding.
- Maintain accurate records of changes, modifications and extra work credits, prepare weekly progress reports and/or schedule of work.
- Check all trades work and materials for conformance to specifications.
- When required, be responsible for supervising the restoration of private property in accordance with agreements.
- Prepare monthly payment estimates for work done, update “as constructed” plans when project is completed and take photos during the construction of the project.

**To be successful, you have:**

- Completion of the 12th school grade, and preferably a two year diploma course in Engineering Technology. Some experience in construction, inspection including drafting and surveying experience OR an equivalent combination of training and experience.
- Some experience in construction, inspection including drafting and surveying experience.
- Good knowledge of engineering mathematics and familiarity with engineering and construction practices.
- Good knowledge of inspection and quality control methods and procedures.
- Working knowledge of standard engineering nomenclature and applicable –construction methods.
- Ability to read and interpret architectural and engineering plans and specifications.
- Ability to prepare reports and estimate costs of construction work.
- Ability to prepare drawing sketches and to perform moderately complex engineering computations.
- Ability to understand and carry out oral and written instructions with minimum supervision.
- Ability to arrange an effective work schedule and perform a variety of clerical tasks related to District engineering functions.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with contractors, the public, other government officials and Metro Vancouver staff.
- Skill in the use of computers and a variety of software, including Microsoft Office.
- Good mechanical and engineering aptitude.
- Good communication skills.
- Valid B.C. Driver’s License.
